'Blank' is a short by an award-winning young filmmaker, exploring limits of sacrifice and responsibility.

Death of a Bureaucrat / La Muerte de un Burocrata (Tomás Gutiérrez Alea, Cuba, 1966, ICAIC, 1h25m)

A satire on bureaucracy, with references from Chaplin and Laurel & Hardy, to Brecht, Eisenstein and Buñuel.

+ NOW! (Santiago Álvarez, Cuba, 1965, ICAIC, 6m)

Short about the civil rights movement in the US by one of the island's most influential documentary filmmakers.

Followed by Q&A with Tania Delgado, director of the Havana Film Festival, and Michael Chanan, filmmaker and writer.

### One Way or Another / De Cierta Manera

(Sara Gómez, Cuba, 1974/7, ICAIC, 1h18m)


ICAIC's first black woman director was creating a new cinematic language to address race, class and gender.

(Sara Gómez, Cuba, 1968, ICAIC, 30m)

History of Cuban jazz, rumba, and dance music via montage capturing the cross-rhythmic nature of music.

Followed by talk by **Tania Delgado**, director of the Havana Film Festival.

Strawberry & Chocolate / Fresa y Chocolate (Tomas Gutierrez Alea & Carlos Tabio, Cuba, 1993, ICAIC, 1h48m)

David, a young Communist student, meets Diego, a flamboyant gay Catholic writer. The film explores homophobia and affirms an inclusive vision for society.

Introduction by Tania Delgado, director of the Havana Film Festival and Gladys González, ICAIC.

The Brothers / Los Hermanos (Marcia Jarmel & Ken Schneider, USA 2021, Patchwork Films, 1h24m)

Moving music documentary about two Cuban virtuoso musicians, one who left for the US and the other who remained in Havana. Separated by the US blockade, they long to play together.

Followed by actor-writer Andy de la Tour in conversation with Cuban musician Omar Puente, record producer Nick Gold and Gladys González, ICAIC.





Yuli: The Carlos Acosta Story (Icíar Bollaín, Spain Cuba Germany UK, 2018, Modern Films, 1h55m)

Award-winning drama about the early life of the Cuban ballet star, with amazing dance sequences.

Supergal / La Súper (Ernesto Pina, Cuba, 2022, ICAIC, 60m)

+ Havana Selfies / Habana Selfies (Arturo Santana, Cuba, 2019, ICAIC, 90m)

La Súper, Cuba's first animated feature, with an unassuming superheroine who confronts violence against women.

Havana Selfies is an urban comedy of thwarted dreams, forming a portrait of Cuba's capital city.

Introduced by Gladys González ICAIC. 10-minute interval between screenings.
